Vice President	What are the standard descriptive characteristics (rules) as listed in the current edition of <i>Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised</i> regarding <u>debating</u> and <u>amending</u> the subsidiary motion, <i>Postpone Indefinitely</i> ?	The subsidiary motion, <i>Postpone Indefinitely</i> is: - Debatable - Not amendable
Secretary	As listed in the <i>Official FFA Manual</i> , the secretary is responsible for having five documents or books on hand for every meeting. Name three of them.	- The secretary's file - Copy of the POA, including all standing and special committees -Official FFA Manual - The Official FFA Student Handbook - Copy of the chapter constitution and bylaws
Treasurer	Name two motions <u>that are permitted in this event</u> that may interrupt a member speaking at a regular FFA chapter meeting.	- Raise a Question of Privilege - Point of Order - Parliamentary Inquiry - Division of the Assembly
Reporter	Assume an FFA chapter meeting is being conducted and 24 members cast a vote on a motion that requires a two-thirds vote. - What is the minimum number of members who must vote in the affirmative to adopt it. - Name an undebatable subsidiary motion that requires a two-thirds vote to be adopted.	16 <i>Previous Question.</i>
