Reporter	1. If a member doubts the announced outcome of a standing vote, can they call for a <i>Division of the Assembly</i> ? Please Explain 2. What vote is required to adopt the incidental motion, <i>Division of the Assembly</i> ?	1. No, division is a call for a standing vote and duplication of votes is dilatory. 2. There is no vote, it is a demand.
