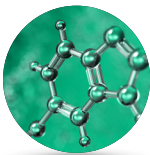

## Fenbendazole Mode of Action:

Different mode of action is what makes Safe-Guard® (fenbendazole) so effective against the most dangerous parasites of the horse



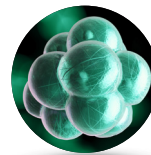
### Deep Penetration
