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OFFICERS	ORAL QUESTIONS	ANSWERS TO ORAL QUESTIONS
President	- How does the president serve on <u>committees</u> as described in the <i>Official FFA Manual</i>? - According to the <i>Official FFA Manual</i>, what accepted rules must be followed by the president when presiding over FFA chapter meetings?	- The president serves on committees as an ex-officio, non-voting member. - The accepted rules of parliamentary procedure or <i>Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised</i>.
Vice President	What are the standard descriptive characteristics (rules) as listed in <i>Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised</i> regarding <u>debating</u> and <u>amending</u> a <i>Parliamentary Inquiry</i> ?	A <i>Parliamentary Inquiry</i>: - is not debatable. - may not be amended.
Secretary	- What vote is required for the adoption of the subsidiary motion <i>Commit or Refer</i>? - What is the minimum affirmative vote required to adopt the subsidiary motion to <i>Commit or Refer</i> if 30 votes are cast at a regular FFA chapter meeting?	- Majority 16
Treasurer	- Name the <u>class</u> of motions that deal with special matters of immediate or overriding importance to the business of the assembly. - How may the privileged motion to <i>Recess</i> be amended?	- Privileged - It may be amended regarding the length of the <i>Recess</i>.
Reporter	One example of when the presiding officer may participate in voting on a <i>Main Motion</i> at a regular FFA chapter meeting is when the vote is taken by a <u>ballot</u> . Name two more examples of when the presiding officer may vote.	- To create a tie - To <u>break</u> a tie
Sentinel	- If an amendment is applied to the privileged motion, <i>Recess</i>, is the amendment debatable? - Explain your answer.	- No - An amendment is debatable if it is applied to a debatable motion. The privileged motion, <i>Recess</i>, is undebatable. Therefore, an amendment applied to it is undebatable.
Advisor	Based on <i>Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised</i> , there are three steps in the <u>consideration</u> of a <i>Main Motion</i> . The first step is that members debate the motion. What are the next two steps?	- The chair <i>puts</i> the question (or puts it to a vote). - The chair announces the result of the vote.
