<i>Postpone Definitely</i>	Today is October 28. What is the latest date that the next meeting can be, if we want to postpone something to that meeting? (8 pts)	1/31/2022 or "end of January" RONR(12th ed.) 14:06
	If a motion is postponed until later in the same meeting, explain what happens to member's rights to debate. (8 pts)	When consideration is resumed at the same session all debate limitations (including speaking 2x) remain in effect. RONR(12th ed.) 14:19
<i>Limit/Extend Limits of Debate</i>	There are 3 conditions for exhaustion of the effect of a motion to Limit/Extend Limits of Debate. What are they? (16 pts)	(1) when all of the questions on which it was imposed have been voted on; (2) when those questions affected by the order and not yet voted on have been either referred to a committee or postponed indefinitely; or (3) at the conclusion of the session in which the order was adopted— whichever occurs first. <i>Division of the Question</i>	The motion for Division of the Question is not debatable, but can have Previous Question applied to it. Can you explain this? (8 pts)	No subsidiary motion can be applied to it alone except Amend and (for the purpose of stopping its amendment) the Previous Question; RONR(12th ed.) 27:3 #2

	If the motion to Refer is adopted while Division of the Question is pending, what happens to the motion for Division of the Question? (8 pts)	...while it is pending the main question can be committed, postponed, or laid on the table, and it then undergoes the same process with the main question. RONR(12th ed.) 27:3 #2
<i>Point of Order</i>	Robert's lists 5 breaches of order of a "continuing nature." List them. (16 pts)	a) a main motion has been adopted that conflicts with the bylaws, b) a main motion has been adopted that conflicts with a main motion previously adopted and still in force, unless the subsequently adopted motion was adopted by the vote required to rescind or amend the previously adopted motion, c) any action has been taken in violation of applicable procedural rules prescribed by federal, state, or local law, d) any action has been taken in violation of a fundamental principle of parliamentary law, or e) any action has been taken in violation of a rule protecting absentees, a rule in the bylaws protecting the secrecy of the members' votes (as on a ballot vote), or a rule protecting a basic right of an individual member. <i>Fix the Time To Which to Adjourn</i>	Explain the effect of the motion "Fix the Time to Which to Adjourn" on when the present meeting adjourns (8 pts)	It has none. RONR(12th ed.) 22:11
	What is the difference between the motion to Fix the Time TO Which to Adjourn and Fix the Time AT Which to Adjourn? (8 pts)	Fix the Time TO Which to Adjourn sets an adjourned meeting, and can be either privileged or a main motion. Fix the Time AT Which to Adjourn sets the time for the current meeting to end and is ALWAYS a main motion RONR (12th ed.) 22:11
<i>Questions for the Chair</i>	The previous meeting was adjourned to meet "at the call of the chair." But the chair didn't call a meeting, and the current meeting starts now. How do we adjourn the previous meeting? (8 pts)	Adjournment of the previous session becomes final retrospectively as of the date the last meeting adjourned, and the chair's authority to call an adjourned meeting expires RONR(12th ed.) 22:8

	When can a question be divided on the demand of a single member, without vote? (8 pts)	Sometimes a series of independent resolutions or main motions dealing with different subjects is offered in one motion. In such a case, one or more of the several resolutions must receive separate consideration and vote at the request of a single member, and the motion for Division of a Question is not used. RONR(12th ed.) 27:10
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
