Reporter	1. What is the purpose of the motion to <i>Commit or Refer</i>? 2. May a member interrupt a member speaking to make the motion <i>Commit or Refer</i>?	1. To refer a motion to a committee. 2. No.
Sentinel	1. Who has the right to be last to debate a <i>Main Motion</i>? 2. A member's debate on a <i>Main Motion</i> must be germane. Explain what this means.	1. No member has a right to debate a <i>Main Motion</i> last. 2. Debate must relate to the subject of the <i>Main Motion</i>.
Advisor	1. Name the motion that demands a standing (rising) vote on a motion. 2. Can the incidental motion, <i>Division of the Assembly</i>, be amended?	1. <i>Division of the Assembly</i>. 2. No.
