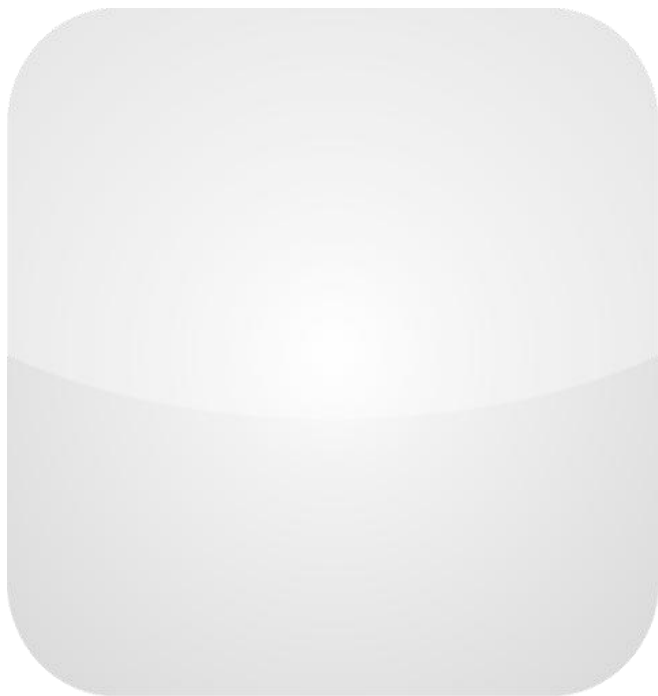

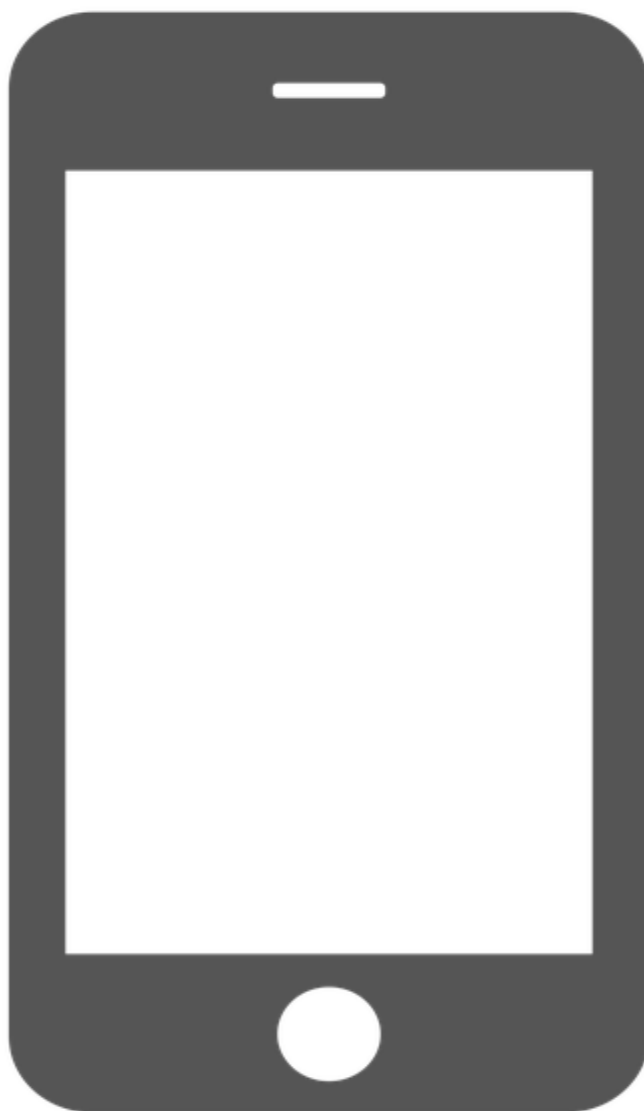
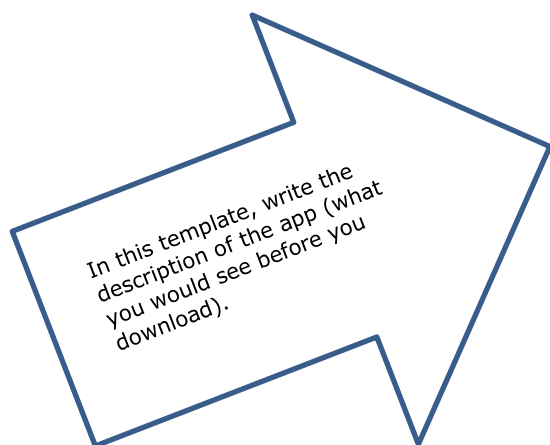
Appendix 1 — Give It an App!

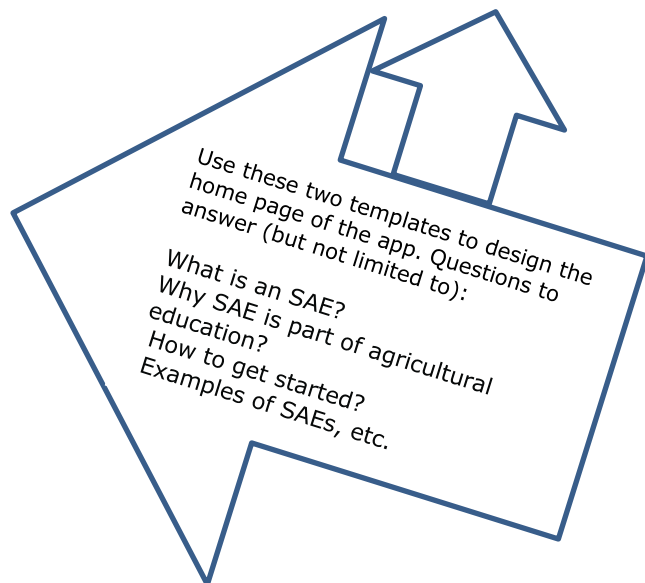
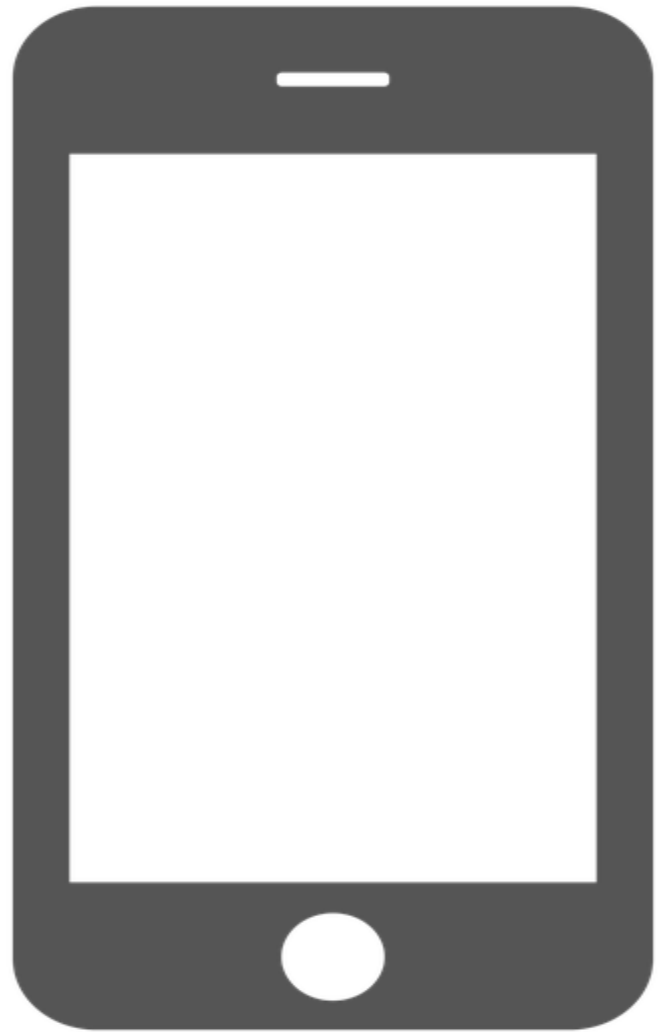
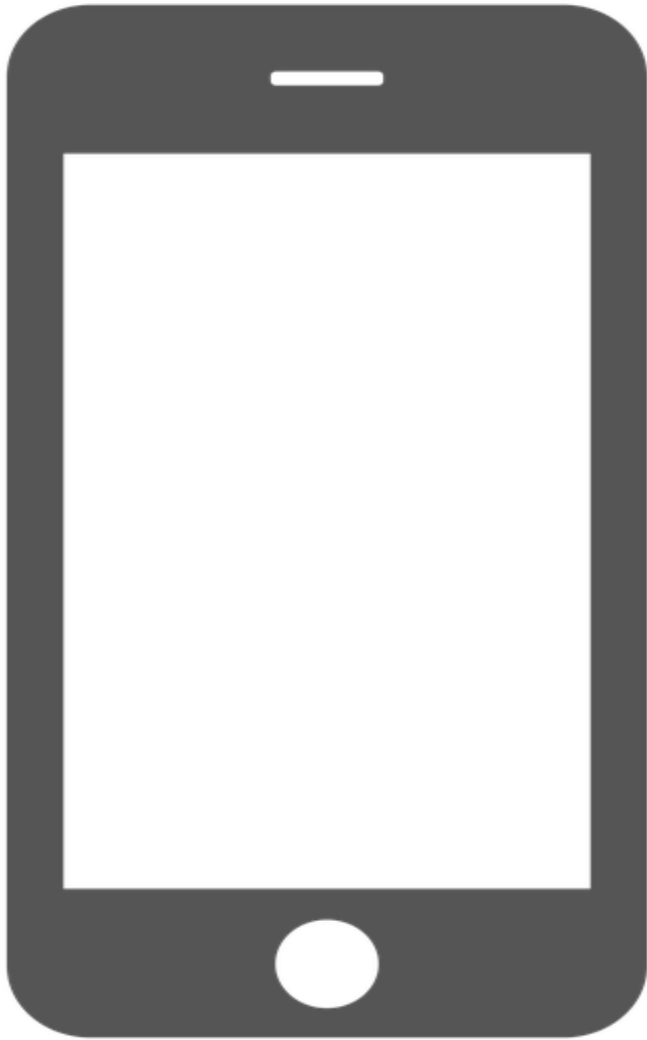

Home button for the app: In this space, design the app logo.



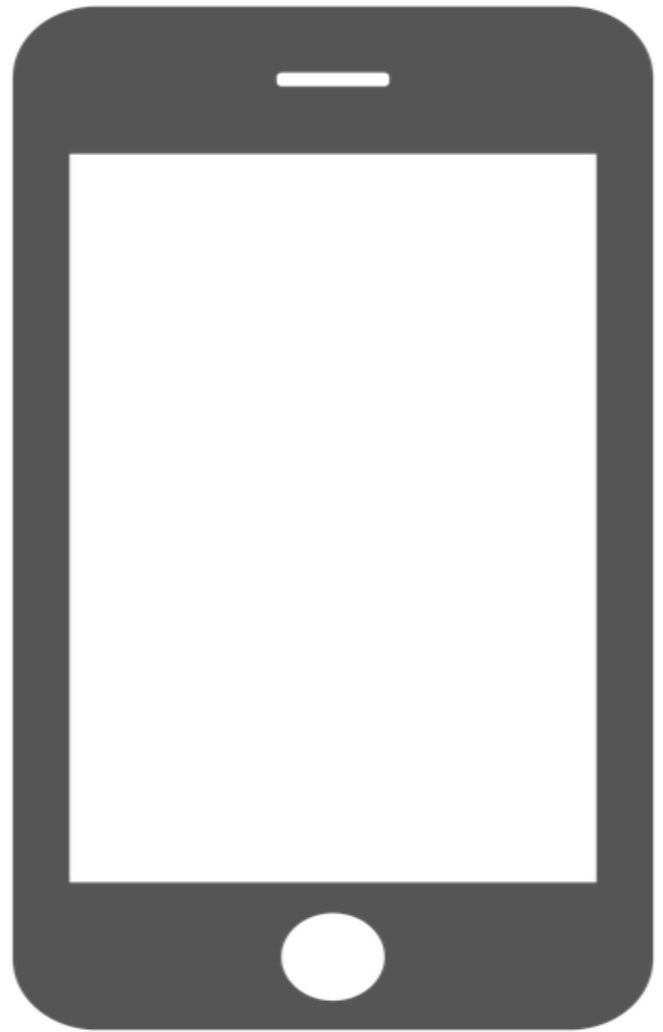
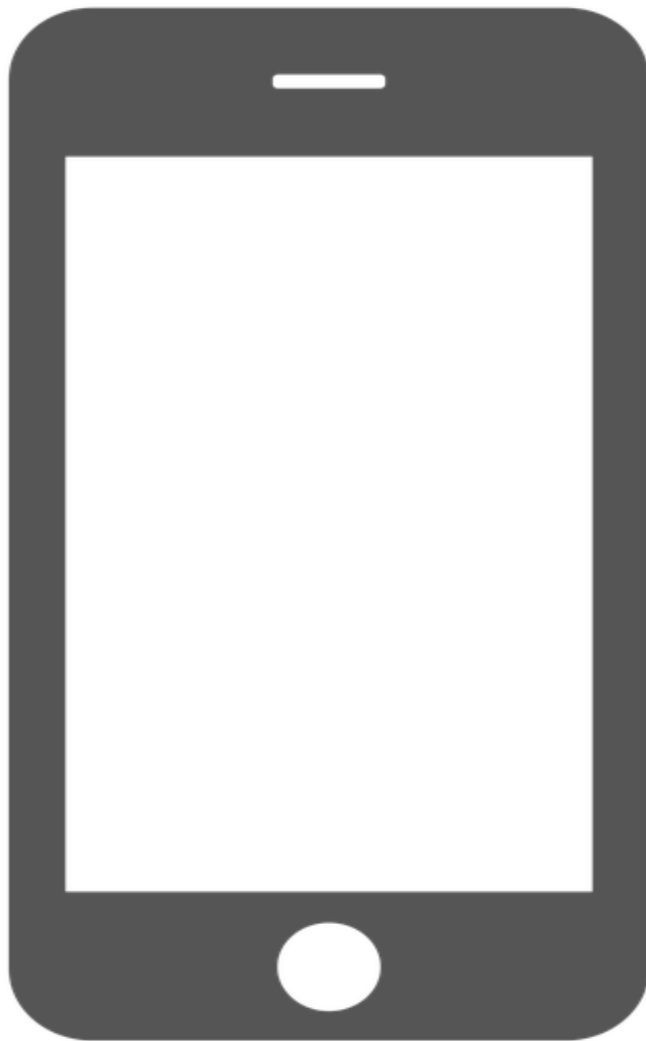

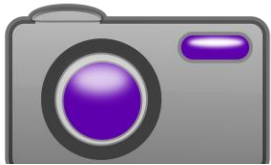

Appendix 2 — Agriculture Blog Post

DIRECTIONS

After watching an SAE video, create a blog post on a current “hot topic” within the agriculture industry. Examples of topics include Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs), gestational crates, “Farm to Plate,” etc. (*A blog is a regularly updated website or web page typically run by an individual or small group that is written in an informal or conversational style.*) Use the advocacy steps on FFA.org (<https://www.ffa.org/ag-literacy-and-advocacy/>) to help you complete the information below.

Title: Create an “attention-getting,” creative title.



Every blog post needs a picture. Describe the picture (in 1 sentence), and draw the picture you will have on your blog post page.

Main body of the blog: In this section, include key factors:

- Why you chose this topic.
- Brief introduction/explanation about this topic.
- 3 to 4 facts about the topic.

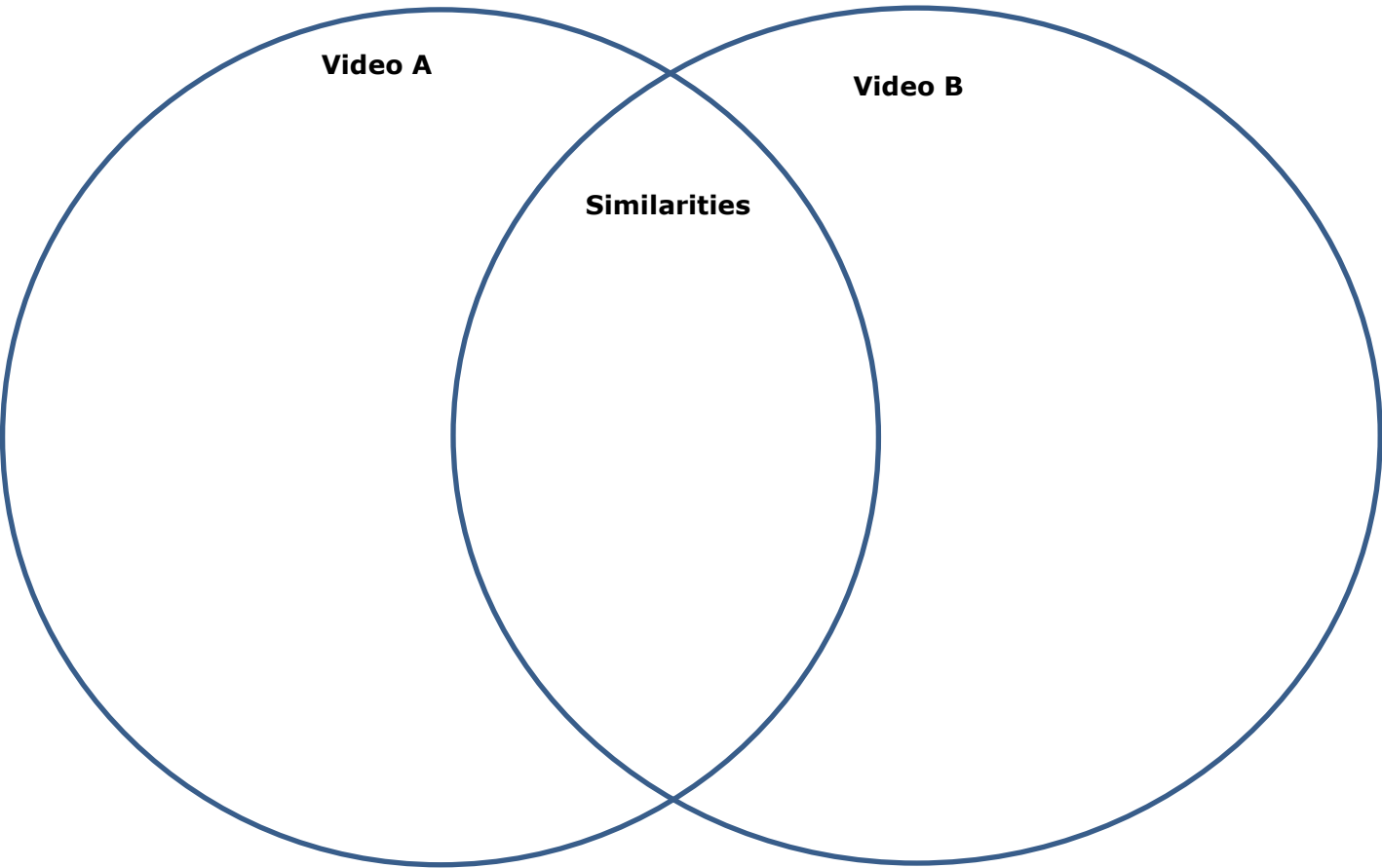

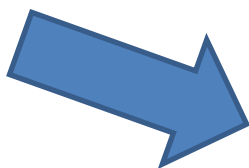
