Scenario

At the October chapter meeting the motion to “Hold a fall hay ride on Saturday, November 23rd “ was introduced and postponed and made a **Special Order for 2:00 pm during the November meeting.**

Main Motion:

I move that our chapter create educational presentations on academic standards learned in Agricultural Education courses.

Required Motions:

Limit or Extend Limits of Debate	Subsidiary
Postpone Indefinitely	Subsidiary
Appeal	Incidental
Parliamentary Inquiry	Incidental
Call for the Orders of the Day	Privileged

Oral Questions

Limit or Extend Limits of Debate

- Q) If a motion to limit debate to a total of 15 minutes on a motion is moved and passed, what other subsidiary motions are out of order?
- A) Commit
Postpone to a Certain Time (Definitely)
- Q) Why are those two motions out of order?
- A) Those motions would be in conflict with the purpose of closing debate after 15 minutes and voting.

Postpone Indefinitely

- Q) If the subsidiary motion to postpone indefinitely is adopted, what effect does it have on the pending main motion?
- A) It suppresses the main motion for the duration of the current session (P. 127-128)
- Q) Name two ways the main motion come before the assembly again?
- A) Reconsider the postpone indefinitely (p. 127, l. 17-18)
Introduce the main motion again at the next meeting.(p. 337. l. 22-23)

Appeal

- Q) When must an appeal be made?
- A) The appeal must be made at the time of the ruling. If any debate or business has intervened, it is too late to appeal. (p. 257, l. 30-31)
- Q) If a debatable appeal is pending, how many times are members allowed to speak?
- A) No member is allowed to speak more than once except the presiding officer. (p. 258, l. 1-2)

Parliamentary Inquiry

- Q) Does a member have to be recognized to rise to a parliamentary inquiry?
- A) No, in making an inquiry, the inquirer arises, and without obtaining the floor, addresses the chair. (p. 294, l. 3-4)
- Q) If the member disagrees with the chair's reply what can he/she do?
- A) Act contrary to the chair's reply and if ruled out of order, appeal the ruling. (p. 294, l. 12-14)

Call for the Orders of the Day

- Q) In the motion to Call for the Orders of the Day, what are the Orders of the Day?
- A) The agenda, program, or order of business for the meeting. (p. 219, l. 4-6)
- Q) What are the two types of orders that are included in the Orders of the Day?
- A) General Orders
Special Orders
(p. 186, l. 7-8)

Chair

- Q) According to *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*, what are the five forms of a deliberative assembly? (p. 5, l. 13-18)
- A) Mass meeting
Assembly of an organized society
Convention
Legislative body
Board
