Recess	Privileged

Commit

- Q) What are three forms of a committee that can be used in deliberative assemblies?
- A) Committee of the Whole
Quasi-Committee of the Whole
Informal Consideration

Lay on the Table

- Q) What are two differences between the motion to Lay on the Table and the motion Postpone Definitely?
- A) Lay on the Table
Highest ranking subsidiary motion
Not debatable or amendable
Sets aside main motion temporarily

Postpone Definitely

- Debatable and Amendable
Sets aside main motion to later in current meeting or next meeting

Parliamentary Inquiry

- Q) What class of motions does Parliamentary Inquiry belong to?
- A) Incidental Motions (Tinted p. 20)
- Q) Request for Information, Withdraw or Modify a Motion, and Parliamentary Inquiry are what type of incidental motions
- A) Requests or Inquiries (p. 292)

Object to the Consideration of the Question

- Q) What vote is required on Object to the Consideration of the Question?
- A) 2/3 vote *against consideration* is required to sustain the objection. (p. 268)

Recess

- Q) What two privileged motions have a higher order of precedence than Recess.
- A) Fix the Time to Which to Adjourn
Adjourn

Chair

- Q) If a motion to Fix the Time to Which to Adjourn to tomorrow at 2:00 pm is moved and carried. What does that create?
- A) It creates an Adjourned Meeting for tomorrow at 2:00 pm. (pg. 244)
- Q) What is the difference between an Adjourned Meeting and a Special Meeting?
- A) A special meeting is a separate session called for between regular meetings which requires notice or call. An Adjourned Meeting is the continuation of a session that does not require notice. (p. 244)
