**Preliminary Round (PM)
Motions & Oral Questions**

I move that our chapter organize a Blood Drive at our school.

Required Motions:

Postpone Indefinitely Subsidiary

Q) A main motion has been postponed indefinitely. Name 2 ways the main motion can be brought before the assembly again?

A) The Postpone Indefinitely can be reconsidered. (p. 127)

The main motion can be renewed at the next regular meeting. “Any motion that is still applicable can be renewed at any later session.” (p. 337).

Limit or Extend Limits of Debate Subsidiary

Q) Can the motion to Limit Debate be used to close debate immediately?

A) “It cannot impose an immediate closing of debate, which requires a different motion - Previous Question.” (p. 191, l. 25-27)

Q) How can the motion to Limit Debate be used to close debate?

A) “Requiring that, at a certain later hour or after debate for a specific length of time, debate shall be closed.” (p. 191. l. 22-25)

Object to the Consideration of a Question Incidental

Q) When is the motion to Object to the Consideration of a Question in order?

A) “The objection can be raised only before there has been any debate or any subsidiary motion except Lay on the Table has been stated by the chair.” (p. 267, l. 27-30)

Parliamentary Inquiry Incidental

- Q) Parliamentary Inquiry, Withdraw a Motion, and Request for Information are all grouped as what type of motions?
- A) Requests and Inquiries (p. 292)
- Q) Is a Parliamentary Inquiry in order when another member has the floor?
- A) “All are in order when another has the floor if they require immediate attention.” (p. 293, l. 1-2)

Adjourn Privileged

- Q) If Adjourn is moved when another motion is pending, what classification of motion is it?
- A) Privileged
- Q) If Adjourn is moved when no other business is pending, what classification of motion is it?
- A) Privileged (p. 233-234)

Chair

- Q) The list of items that are scheduled to be addressed during a meeting has four different names. Can you list them? (p. 351, l. 16-17)
- A) Order of Business
