During lunch you notice your horse has yet to finish his grain and see him slightly kicking at his stomach, although you don't think much about it. Later that night you walk back into the barn to your horse lying on the ground; you immediately call your vet. Your vet tells you he believes your horse is showing signs of colic and that he is unavailable for the next few hours. He suggests that you give the horse Banamine and walk him until he arrives. You know your horse weighs approximately 1200 lbs. You have injectable and paste Banamine available to you.

1. How many CC's of Banamine should you administer your horse via injection?
2. What is the preferred injection site for Banamine?
3. Should the Banamine injection be given intravenously or intramuscularly?
4. Where should Banamine paste be administered?
5. How many mg's should you administer your horse via paste?
